## WELCOME TO THE SILCHESTER PLAYERS

The Silchester Players grew out of a fundraising production in 1975 by a group of local people who put on an old time music hall to raise money for Leukemia Research. The show was a great success and the group adopted the name "Silchester Players".

The Silchester Players is a strong community group bringing local people together to put on award winning amateur dramatic productions for the local community and in keeping with the original ethos continue to donate money from each show to charity. To date we have donated in excess of £45,000. The Players also continue to actively support local groups.

# NODA - NATIONAL OPERATIC AND DRAMATIC ASSOCIATION.

The Silchester Players are a member of NODA. You will be asked to pay an annual membership fee:

- f12 adults
- £6 juniors
- £24 family membership

This covers our affiliation to NODA and importantly includes insurance.

A NODA representative attends and reviews each of our productions.

The Regional NODA group has an annual awards ceremony and we have been fortunate to receive Accolades of Excellence for "The Importance of Being Earnest 2012" "Twelfth Night 2014" "Blithe Spirit 2018" and "Treasure Island 2019". A huge achievement as we are grouped regionally with much larger groups who have access to greater resources.

## **PRODUCTIONS**

We put on three productions every year: Winter, Spring and Autumn; a pantomime, a comedy and a drama

# Auditions take place:

- February for our Spring production in May
- June for our Autumn production in October
- Oct /Nov for our pantomime end of January beginning of February

#### **AUDITIONS**

At auditions we ask you sign up for the skills you most want to deliver or learn.

Potential actors and actresses are asked to read selected parts of the next production.

The Director/Producer then notifies each person over the next week of the role they would like you to carry out.

Children are invited to audition for pantomime (the age of entry is at the discretion of the director).

Once auditions have taken place we meet at Silchester Village Hall twice a week to rehearse on Tuesday and Thursday / Friday 7.30-9.30pm. Refreshments are provided and we ask for a donation of 20p towards the cost of tea/coffee and biscuits.

Rehearsals are followed by a swift beverage at the local public house if you wish to join in extending the evening.

Pantomime includes a Sunday rehearsal for children and chorus until January when they join the rest of the cast.

### SET BUILD

Each show involves a vast array of skills to achieve the final performances. Set build takes place over several weekends which involve painting and building sets, and rigging technical equipment. Tea/coffee and doughnuts are provided.

#### PERFORMANCES

During the week of the show we have an additional rehearsal for each of our productions on the Sunday, this is our technical rehearsal, it

includes all cast and crew with costumes and makeup. The purpose of this is to fine tune technical aspects of the production.

Tuesday of this week is a full dress rehearsal and then we go straight into our weekend performances:

Tickets for the performances can be purchased online or via the telephone number on our publicity posters.

After each first night, when adrenaline is still running and excitement overflows with our achievement, we meet after the show for a "first night curry."

As a mark of appreciation for the enormous amount of hard work which goes into production and direction we like to have a modest collection during the run of each show to purchase small thank you gifts. One of the senior members of the cast usually arranges this and organises the presentation to the director/producer on stage after the final curtain on the last night.

After each last night one of our members opens their house for an after-show party, a celebration of three months of fun and hard work. This is followed the next day (Sunday) by meeting at the hall to all pitch in for the set break which includes bacon butties tea and coffee.

# ANNUAL GENERAL MEETING

You are invited to attend the AGM in June where the year's productions / finances / constitution and issues are discussed.

The Silchester Players have a committee of 10-12 members who are elected by the group at the AGM. The committee meets regularly to manage the running of the Players.
